The capital is a letterform that tells our story. The story of an organization that creates connections that matter.

When the "B" is used alone, we call it The Capital. It is a powerful symbol of the real-life match that creates a whole, greater than the sum of its parts.



This idea represents the story of a Little and their parents or guardians aligning with our organization to build momentum toward reaching their full potential. The elements of the lowercase b stand as a powerful symbol but do not tell the complete story.



With the addition of Bigs, the equal parts create meaningful intersection. As the upper piece of the B is added, the relationship balances and becomes stronger and bigger.





OUR MENTORS ARE A BIG DEAL

SCHOOL-PLUS PROGRAM

It may sound obvious, but sometimes the best place to help a child realize their potential is at school. Kids enjoy having their Bigs meet with them there, whether it's in the classroom or on the playground. Teachers report that students come back from time with their Big filled with confidence, smiling, ready to learn, and eager to succeed. In 2018, we served 73 children in our School-Plus Program! School-Plus partners included William Wells Brown, Booker T. Washington, and Breckinridge Elementary Schools in Fayette

County.



COMMUNITY-BASED PROGRAM

Many of our Bigs and Littles participate in our Community-Based Program. Community-Based mentoring relationships involve one-on-one outings and activities doing things Bigs and Littles can enjoy together, like taking a walk in the park, going to a museum, attending one of our events, or just hanging out and talking! Some get together with their Littles on weekday evenings. Some meet one hour each week. Some meet for several hours one day every month. Each match is unique and develops a schedule that works for them. **As of 2018**,

we are happy to report that the average match length in our Community-Based Program exceeded 2.5 years!


HIGH SCHOOL BIGS PROGRAM

In addition to our traditional School-Plus Program, we also offer a High School Bigs program in Montgomery and Jessamine Counties. This program matches elementary school children with high school students for a fun learning experience for both the Big and Little. Much like our School-Plus Program, these matches meet an hour a week at the Little's school. At the end of the day, it's really all about starting a friendship, providing guidance and inspiring a child to reach their potential — and our High School Bigs are left with a unique, eye-opening experience that helps them become more well-rounded adults. In 2018, we had over 60 active

Bigs in our High School Bigs Program. High School Bigs elementary school partners included Camargo, Mapleton, Mt. Sterling, and Northview

Elementary Schools in Montgomery County, and Rosenwald Dunbar in Jessamine County.

OUR RECRUITMENT INITIATIVES

In 2018, we recruited 116 new volunteers as Bigs. In addition to our general efforts to recruit Big Brothers and Big Sisters in communities across Central Kentucky, BBBS Bluegrass has also initiated two unique recruitment efforts over the course of the last two years. We believe that diversifying our volunteer group not only strengthens our ability to serve youth, but also helps bridge the gap between populations that might not otherwise have the opportunity to positively interact on a regular basis.

POLICE OFFICERS AS BIGS





Bigs in Blue is a one-to-one mentoring program that connects youth with police in communities throughout Central Kentucky, building strong, trusting, lasting relationships. These relationships can help build stronger bonds between law enforcement and the families they serve.

In 2018, we presented the Lexington Police Department with the Silvey Award, recognizing their excellence as a BBBS Community Partner. We also held our second annual Dunk-A-Cop event in Richmond with the Richmond Police Department, which was a ton of fun!

"Mentoring our youth is very important – not just for today, but for our future," Lexington Police Chief Lawrence Weathers says. "It's also important for our young people to know that the police are there to help them, to guide them, and to try to make their lives as successful as possible."

MEN OF COLOR RECRUITMENT

At BBBS Bluegrass, young males of color make up more than half of our waiting list, many of whom have been waiting for a Big Brother for more than two years. They come to us with the hopes of finding a mentor who will inspire them to reach beyond their adversity.



In an effort to recruit more men of color to serve as Bigs, we began our Brothers Reaching Back campaign in the spring of 2018. Since the program's inception, we have more than doubled the number of men of color serving as Bigs! But, we still have a long way to go. 

In October of 2018 shortly after our rebrand, we launched the 10 for 10 Campaign in an effort to spread the word about our mission and to impact the lives of even more children. For 10 days during the month of October, Defenders from across the region joined forces to share our powerful new messaging, and attempted to raise 10, \$10 donations each. They also had the opportunity to earn swag and win cool prizes along the way. The request was small, but with our powers combined, the outcome was BIG. In its first year, the 10 for 10 Campaign surpassed its \$10,000 goal by over \$6,000! The 10 for 10 Campaign will be back in 2019, and we

can't wait to see what our Defenders are able to accomplish in year 2!
