BBBS BLUEGRASS RELOCATES FAYETTE COUNTY OFFICE

In the summer of 2019, Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Bluegrass moved to a new office location in Fayette County and later hosted a ribbon cutting ceremony. Remarks were made by Mayor Linda Gorton and other special guests. The new address is 181 W. Lowry Lane, Suite 150, in Lexington next to Kentucky Dentistry for Kids.

"The move into this new space with billboard-style signage will hopefully help us as we continue our efforts to recruit more volunteers to our agency," Andrea Ooten, President and CEO of BBBS Bluegrass, said. "Our office might have changed but our need for more volunteer mentors has not. Hopefully, this will help serve as a reminder and keep us in the forefront when individuals are making decisions about where they want to invest their support."



OUR IMPACT IS EVIDENT

WHAT ARE ADVERSE CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES (ACES)?

According to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), ACEs are potentially traumatic events that occur in childhood, including exposure to experiences like:













In a study published in November 2019, the CDC stated that traumatic events in childhood can be emotionally painful or distressing and can have effects that persist for years. However, 6 strategies were identified as being proven to mitigate the harms of ACEs.

2020 RECRUITMENT INITIATIVES



SPORTS BUDDIES PROGRAM

The Sports Buddies Mentoring Program launched in Lexington in January 2020 and provides unique opportunities for boys on our waiting list to participate in and watch sports with a kind and caring adult role model. While still a one-to-one mentoring program, Sports Buddies also offers additional structure and guidance in a group setting, as matches attend sporting events together with a professional BBBS staff member present.

SCHOOL-PLUS PROGRAM

School-Plus matches meet during the school day on the same day and time each week. In 2019, we expanded our School-Plus Program to include Tates Creek and Millcreek Elementary Schools in Fayette County. Other partners included William Wells Brown, Booker T. Washington, and Breckinridge Elementary Schools in Fayette County. In 2019, BBBS Bluegrass also received the Golden Apple Award for our partnership with the Fayette County School System.





COMMUNITY-BASED PROGRAM

Community-Based mentoring relationships involve one-on-one outings and activities doing things Bigs and Littles can enjoy together, like taking a walk in the park, going to a museum, attending one of our events, or just hanging out and talking! While most matches meet in the evenings or on the weekends, each match is unique and develops a schedule that works for them.

HIGH SCHOOL BIGS PROGRAM

In addition to our traditional School-Plus Program, we also offer a High School Bigs program in Montgomery and Jessamine Counties. This program matches elementary school children with high school students for a fun learning experience for both the Big and Little. In 2019, we had over 60 active Bigs in our High School Bigs Program. High School Bigs elementary school partners included Camargo, Mapleton, Mt. Sterling, and Northview Elementary Schools in Montgomery County, and Rosenwald Dunbar in Jessamine County.



MEET OUR 2019 AWARD WINNERS

Each year during our Match Appreciation Celebration, we recognize several individuals who have made a significant impact on our program over the course of the last year. Our **Big Brother and Big Sister of the Year Awards** highlight Bigs who have been matched in our program for longer than a year who have gone above and beyond; the **Silvey Award** is presented to a community partner who has worked alongside of BBBS to improve our programming and expand our reach; and the **Mike Scanlon Award** is presented to a BBBS board member who has been an outstanding leader to our organization.

BOWL FOR KIDS' SAKE

Bowl for Kids' Sake (BFKS) is a longstanding tradition and our largest annual fundraiser, attracting more than 500 individuals from across Central Kentucky each year. Each spring, matches, families, sponsors, and community partners in Fayette, Madison and Montgomery counties come together for an afternoon of bowling, food, drinks, prizes, fun, and memories. In 2019, we raised over \$106,000 during BFKS with the help of our supporters and sponsors!







The Fly Away Bash draws hundreds of people from across Central Kentucky out for a night in support of our cause. For the past three years, this fun, gala-style event has featured an evening full of delicious food and live entertainment. Each guest in attendance has an opportunity to win a trip to a pre-determined destination with the purchase of their ticket, with past events featuring trips to Charleston, New Orleans, and Miami. In 2019, The Fly Away Bash raised over \$35,000 after expenses!

10 FOR \$10 CAMPAIGN

For 10 days during the month of October, Defenders from across the region join forces to share our powerful new messaging, and attempt to raise 10, \$10 donations each. Over 100 Defenders participated in 2019. In its second year, the 10 for \$10 Campaign was joined by Lead Defender Hicks & Funfsinn and raised \$20,000 for Big Brothers Big Sisters! Our top fundraiser for the second year in a row was Big Brother Jeff Whitford.





DANCING WITH OUR STARS
